

[COUNTDOWN BEEPS]

[THEME MUSIC]

**DAN DE LEON:** Hi, I'm Dan De Leon.

SUZANNE ANDERSON Leon. And I'm Suzanne Anderson, and you are watching *TV Montrose*.

**DAN DE LEON:** Suzanne, I missed being here last week and introducing a new name of our show, *Out TV Texas*, starting on May 3 with our partner Jose Luis Partida and NueVision Entertainment in Dallas.

**SUZANNE ANDERSON:** That's right, Dan. And this week, we're going to take a sneak preview at the new logo. And I'm going to let you introduce it.

**SUZANNE ANDERSON:** And then we're going to look at a music video that showcase people and events from shows 13 through 18. And keep in mind, this is episode 55.

**SUZANNE** OK. Put on your space suits and let's go to planet Rich's and get lost in space.

**EARL:** And if someone wanted to belong to Outrage, what's the process? How does someone become a member?

**RAUL GONZALES:** Well, actually, we're not that selective as far as-- you have to be brought in by a couple of members. If you would like to become a member, just contact one of our members. Or you can get our number off the back of the twit or in the Alsmore guide.

Give us a call in our line we'll contact you. And we have rush parties through the year for new members. So they can meet us and decide whether they want to belong to us as well as we want them.
